This was the theme for assemblies and PSHE discussions last week. We will continue to ensure that bullying is not tolerated anywhere in our community. We wore odd socks to school to celebrate how wonderfully unique we all are!

For Children in Need Day, the student leaders facilitated hula-hooping and basketball challenges for pupils in each class during the morning. In the afternoon there was a whole-class art session, where

each class produced a collaborative piece of Pudsey artwork.

They were challenged to be innovative and creative - and they didn't disappoint! We will be voting for our favourite winning pieces this week and will let you know. The children thoroughly enjoyed taking part in the whole day. Well done to the student leaders! We raised £183.78 for this incredible charity.



On Tuesday, children took part in activities based around protecting our environment (one of our school values)



to celebrate and raise the profile of the launch of **COP29** (The United Nations Climate Change Conference). Early years pupils learnt about plastic in the ocean and recycling before making junk models using recyclable materials.
