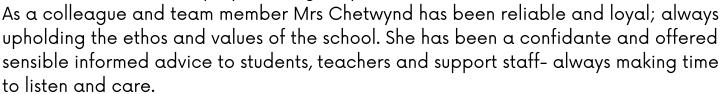
Next Tuesday, Mrs Elaine Chetwynd will be retiring form Two Gates Primary School after 27 years of loyal service as a teaching assistant.
