

#### Following the DfE's guidance, there are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvements across:

**Key indicator 1:** the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.

Key indicator 2: the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.

**Key Indicator 3:** increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.

**Key Indicator 4:** broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

**Key Indicator 5:** increased participation in competitive sport
